CONFERENCES AND NETWORK MEETINGS

More than 4,000 nurse educators attend AACN's conferences each year making these offerings the preferred professional development option for baccalaureate and graduate nursing program faculty.

DOCTORAL EDUCATION CONFERENCE

Deans, directors, and faculty who teach in doctoral programs, as well as those with primary responsibility for advancing research agendas, convene annually at this conference. National trends in doctoral education, strategies to increase enrollment, and methods to maintain quality in doctoral education are hallmarks of this conference. With content addressing both the practice and the research doctorate, attendees are encouraged to consider and debate issues central to doctoral education. FACULTY DEVELOPMENT CONFERENCE

This conference targets faculty early in their careers and is designed to strengthen the essential skills needed to teach in professional nursing programs.
