- Check color contrast.
- Check for color blindness.
- Educate clients.

Color and Contrast Guidelines (WCAG 2.1 AA)

- 1.4.1 Use of Color (Level A): Color cannot be the only visual means of:
 - conveying information,
 - · indicating an action,
 - prompting a response,
 - distinguishing a visual element.
- 1.4.3 Contrast Minimum (Level AA)
 - Normal Text (4.5 to 1): 14 pt/18.66 px or less
 - Large Text (3 to 1): At least 14 pt/18.66
 px and bold, or at least 18 pt/24 px
 - Hyperlinks: 3 to 1 contrast with surrounding body text

- 1.4.11 Non-text Contrast (Level AA):
 Minimum 3 to 1 against adjacent color(s)
 - User interface components and their states
 - Graphical objects
- No Contrast Requirements
 - Logos
 - Decorative images
 - Inactive user interface components
 - Content not visible to anyone
 - Images that contain significant other visual content
 - Heat maps
 - Screenshots
