

In partnership with NYCDOE, CUNY is pleased to provide DOE teachers with an opportunity to earn a tuition-free 15 credit micro-credential in mathematics content and pedagogy. This micro-credential will provide graduate coursework focusing on instructional practice and content that is critical to student success in Algebra I and beyond.

| Why should I consider the Algebra for All micro-credential?

- Your school is an Algebra for All school. This coursework is aligned with Algebra for All professional learning sessions.
- **Support algebraic thinking in all grades**. Learn how Algebraic thinking is introduced in early childhood and developed over time to support deep conceptual understanding.
- It might help you qualify for a salary differential. The micro-credential will provide you 15 credits tuition free, focused in a subject area.
- You receive a verifiable digital credential from CUNY. You will receive a digital badge that verifies that you have completed this micro-credential.
- **Join a great community of educators**. Meet and take class with motivated teachers from outside your building who teach different grades and have different math backgrounds.
- You are a special education teacher or ELL specialist. This micro-credential provides critical content and pedagogy for ELL and special education teachers who support students with mathematics.
- You can earn CTLE credit.

| How do I get started?

- First we encourage you to discuss the opportunity with your colleagues. If you co-teach with a special education teacher, prioritize math on your CEP, or have other teachers you collaborate with on math consider applying with those teachers and sharing your plans with administrators.
