The U.S. Department of Labor's Trade Adjustment Assistance Community College and Career Training (TAACCCT) grant program was a major investment to increase the ability of community colleges to address the challenges of today's workforce.

\$1.9 BILLION AWARDED OVER 4 YEARS

The TAACCCT program was designed to serve a diverse population of workers eligible for training under the TAA for Workers program, as well as a broad range of other adults.


