European Electronic Communications Code

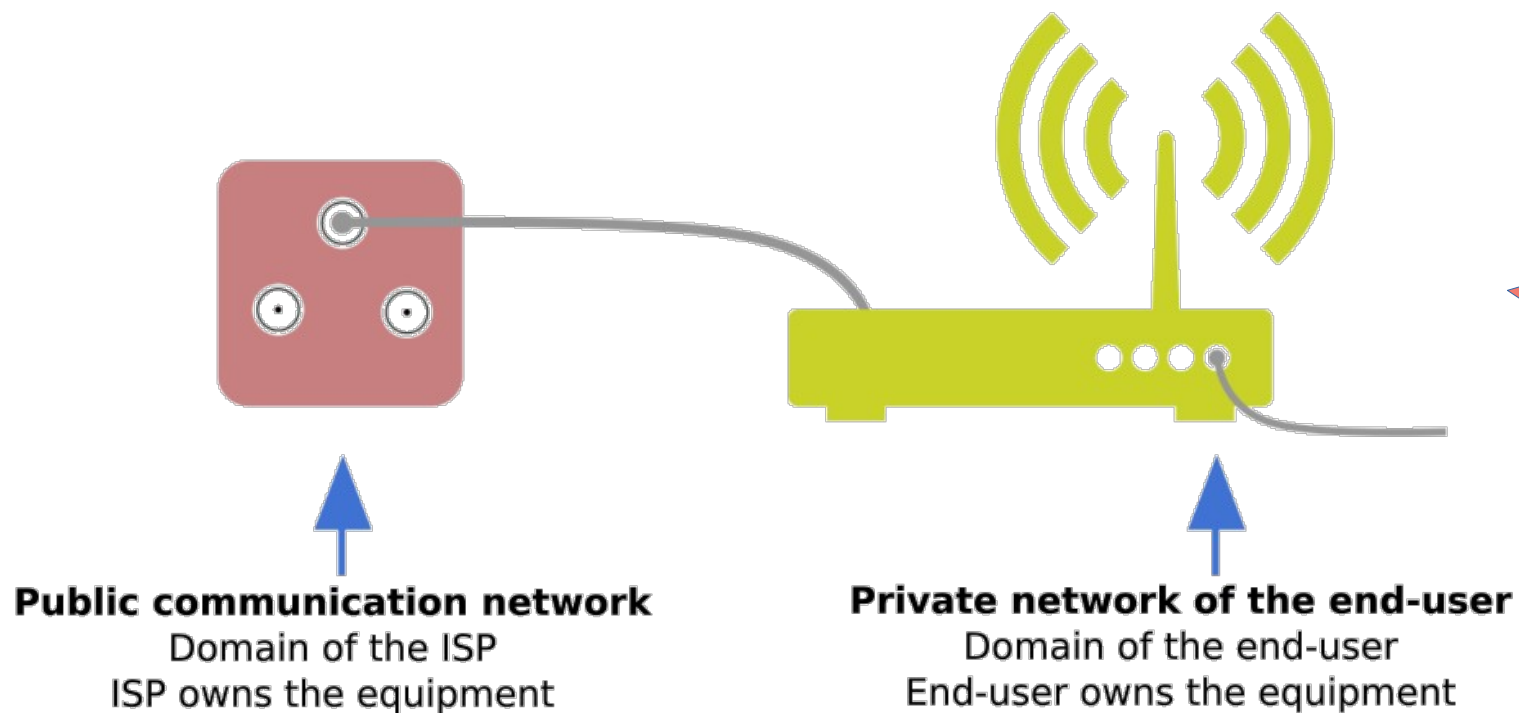
. Definitions need to be adjusted to ensure Net Neutrality.

Network Termination Point



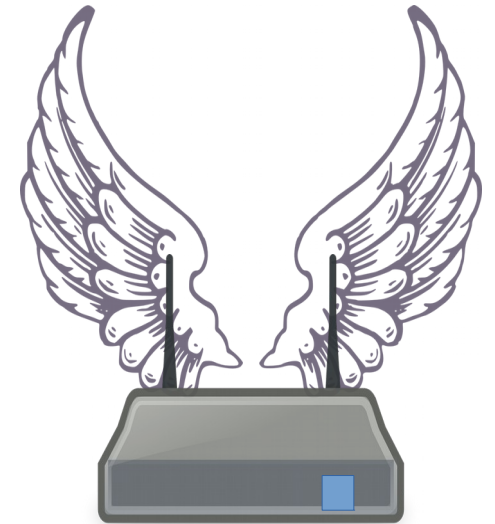
