


## Senior Enlisted Joint Professional Military Education (SEJPME)

Enlisted Joint Professional Military Education provides a competitive advantage to the US military. The Senior Enlisted Joint Professional Military Education (SEJPME) program provides CJCS-sponsored, assignment-oriented educational opportunities for enlisted leaders serving in or designated to serve within the Joint Interagency Intergovernmental and Multinational environment. The program is designed to instill in students a primary commitment to the attitudes and perspectives of joint operations so they may confidently and competently assimilate quickly, contribute effectively to joint assignments, and mentor the junior enlisted leaders and personnel they supervise.

Program staff work continuously to enhance SEJPME courses on JKO and recently updated the SEJPME I course to a curriculum format based upon subject matter expert input and student feedback. The new curriculum format offers the following improvements:








- Pretest scores do not count toward the overall course score, but students will receive credit for mastered content areas.
- The post-test score at the end of the module will count as the student's overall score.
- Students can go back at any time and review skipped content from sections they tested out of (to students these areas will appear as bypassed and their course progress shown as checkmarked).
- Students who perform exceptionally well on the pre-test may accelerate the rate of completion while ensuring learning objectives are met.
