
Risks of dual pharmacy use



Researchers wanted to find out if Veterans who use both VA and Medicare drug benefits were at higher risk of receiving overlapping presciptions for opioids (for pain) and benzodiazapenes (to ease anxiety)—a potentially dangerous drug combination.

Conclusion: "Among a national cohort of veterans dually enrolled in VA and Medicare, receiving prescriptions from both sources was associated with greater risk for receiving potentially unsafe overlapping prescriptions for opioids and benzodiazepines."
