This Tuesday, the United States Senate voted, 57-40, in favor of Senator Rand Paul's Congressional Review Act resolution to overturn the CDC's federal mask mandate for planes, trains, buses, and other public transportation hubs. This legislation in the Senate mirrors a House <u>bill</u> that I am currently leading with Rep. Brian Mast (FL-18).
