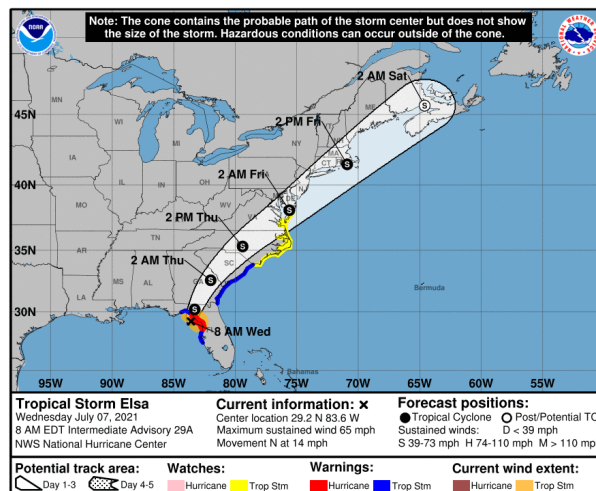
Friends,

As Tropical Storm Elsa has made landfall and speeds toward North Carolina, I wanted to share some resources and information.

The National Weather Service is predicting 1-3 inches of rainfall for our area, with the potential for some local areas across Eastern North Carolina receiving up to 5 inches of rain through Thursday night. We have experienced the effects of tropical storms and hurricanes before, and we know just how devastating they can be.

While Tropical Storm Elsa is not projected to have the same impact as some of the storms that have struck us over the past decade, it is critical that we remain prepared. My office stands ready to assist the residents of the Ninth Congressional District before, during, and after the storm.
