GOVERNED BY AIR FORCE POLICY DIRECTIVES 90-8 AND 32-70

A FPD 90-8 establishes Air Force policy for Environment, Sefetive 100 for Environment, Safety, and Occupational Health (ESOH) and Risk Management Programs, directs development of the EMS to provide oversight, achieve goals, and empowers Airmen to minimize risk in daily activities.

AFPD 32-70 AFPD 32-70 establishes policy to address environmental considerations in all Air Force programs and activities. The policy assigns duties and responsibilities, establishes long-term goals, and defines specific environmental programs.
