#### MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

At 1:32 p.m., a message from the House of Representatives, delivered by Mrs. Cole, one of its reading clerks, announced that the House has passed the following bill, in which it requests the concurrence of the Senate:

H.R. 5434. An act to provide an extension of Federal-aid highway, highway safety, and transit programs, and for other purposes.

#### ADDITIONAL COSPONSORS

S. 535

At the request of Mr. Inhofe, his name was added as a cosponsor of S.

535, a bill to authorize the location of a memorial on the National Mall to commemorate and honor the members of the Armed Forces that served on active duty in support of the Global War on Terrorism, and for other purposes.

S. 110

At the request of Mr. BOOKER, the name of the Senator from Hawaii (Ms. HIRONO) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1106, a bill to prohibit the sale of shark fins, and for other purposes.

S. 1170

At the request of Mrs. GILLIBRAND, the name of the Senator from Georgia (Mr. Ossoff) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1170, a bill to amend the Richard B. Russell National School Lunch Act to improve the efficiency of summer meals.

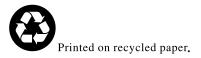
S. 1186

At the request of Mr. BOOKER, the name of the Senator from Washington (Mrs. Murray) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1186, a bill to provide standards for facilities at which aliens in the custody of the Department of Homeland Security are detained, and for other purposes.

S. 1780

At the request of Mr. Booker, the name of the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. Blumenthal) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1780, a bill to remove college cost as a barrier to every student having access to a well-prepared and diverse educator workforce, and for other purposes.

S. 2332

At the request of Mr. BOOKER, the name of the Senator from Massachusetts (Mr. Markey) was added as a cosponsor of S. 2332, a bill to place a moratorium on large concentrated animal feeding operations, to strengthen the Packers and Stockyards Act, 1921, to require country of origin labeling on beef, pork, and dairy products, and for other purposes.

S. RES. 360

At the request of Mrs. Shaheen, the names of the Senator from Delaware (Mr. Coons) and the Senator from Iowa (Mr. Grassley) were added as cosponsors of S. Res. 360, a resolution celebrating the 30th anniversary of the independence of Ukraine from the former Soviet Union.

S RES 398

At the request of Mr. WYDEN, the names of the Senator from Idaho (Mr. CRAPO), the Senator from Iowa (Mr. GRASSLEY), the Senator from New Hampshire (Ms. HASSAN), the Senator from Wisconsin (Ms. BALDWIN), the Pennsylvania Senator from (Mr. CASEY), the Senator from Minnesota (Ms. KLOBUCHAR) and the Senator from Indiana (Mr. Young) were added as cosponsors of S. Res. 398, a resolution

#### SURFACE TRANSPORTATION EXTENSION ACT OF 2021

Mr. WYDEN. Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent that the Senate proceed to the immediate consideration of H.R. 5434, which is at the desk.

The PRESIDENT pro tempore. The clerk will report the bill by title.

The senior assistant legislative clerk read as follows:

A bill (H.R. 5434) to provide an extension of Federal-aid highway, highway safety, and transit programs, and for other purposes.

There being no objection, the Senate proceeded to consider the bill.

Mr. WYDEN. Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent that the bill be considered read a third time and passed, and that the motion to reconsider be considered made and laid upon the table.

The PRESIDENT pro tempore. Without objection, it is so ordered.

The bill (H.R. 5434) was ordered to a third reading, was read the third time, and passed.
