Climate is hugely important to The Independent and we run are currently running exclusives, evergreen content and explainers in the countdown to Cop 26 in Glasgow, where we will staff a full climate and political team.

We focus intently on climate including the recent IPCC report, holding the government to account on its environmental pledges, as well as Joe Biden's Earth summit earlier this year. In May, we launched a campaign against funding fossil fuel companies and continue to run stories on this theme. Other areas of interest include Extinction Rebellion protests; innovative solutions to stopping climate change; rewilding; analysis on steps consumers can take to be more environmentally friendly and unusual stories about climate.




