<p>the Sustainable Development Goals</p> <p>Learning outcomes: students should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create a tree with roots that depict favourable conditions for the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals • Connect how trees benefit humans and the planet in similar ways to the Sustainable Development Goals <p>Description:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ask the students to create an organized crime tree with roots and branches/leaves that is part of a larger ecosystem fed by various cultural and social practices, policies and people. • The objective is to create a tree with roots that depict conditions that support the 	<p>Learning outcomes: students should be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop an alternative ending to the story in the video • Role-play strategies to deescalate potentially violent situations <p>Description:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After viewing the video, introduce the Sustainable Development Goals to the students using the handout on the Sustainable Development Goals. • Read Sustainable Development Goal 16.4 with the class and discuss with the students how this Goal relates to organized crime. • Share the sample organized crime tree diagram with the students. 	<p>Description:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After viewing the video, discuss how organized crime takes various forms around the world. • Divide the students into groups and assign each group a country or a region, and ask them to research forms of organized crime in their country or region. • Students can find information online and offline on organized crime in different countries and regions by referencing newspapers, magazines and news programmes. • Conclude by discussing any patterns that the students have noticed with regard to organized crime activity or any questions that might have about organized crime. 	
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<p>achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals and the prevention of organized crime. The leaves or branches should depict outcomes linked to these conditions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide context by helping the students understand the importance of trees to a healthy ecosystem. Ask the students to identify ways that trees benefit humans, the climate and the planet, and ways that the Sustainable Development Goals benefit humans, the climate and the planet. • Share the forest of organized crime trees on a bulletin board or wall to raise awareness. <p>Examples of how trees benefit us:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They provide shade and cool places • They release oxygen into the air 	<p>Key message:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Combating organized crime is referenced as a critical target in Sustainable Development Goal 16.4. 		
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<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They clean the air by absorbing carbon dioxide • They prevent erosion and enrich the soil <p>Extension activity:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Create an integrity tree as a contrast to an organized crime tree <p>Key message:</p> <p>It is important to raise awareness of organized crime and to address what fuels demand for the products and services offered by organized criminal groups.</p>			
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
