Vermont Tech Nursing Programs

Randolph Center, White River Junction offers career progression to pursue nursing careers. The program allows for the completion of the Practical Nursing (PN) certificate, followed by an associate of science degree in Nursing (ADN), leading to eligibility for RN licensure and culminating with the BS degree in nursing (BSN). Vermont Tech also offers an LPN and an RN **re-entry program** for those whose licenses have lapsed.

VSAC's federally funded adult program, Education Opportunity Center (EOC), is a state-wide program that provides assistance with career decision-making, educational choice, and financial aid to help adults successfully enroll in postsecondary education to begin working toward their education and career goals. As a federal TRIO program, we promote education and training to end the cycle of poverty.

VSAC's EOC Program provides:

- assistance linking career choices with education
- information on education opportunities for first-time and transfer students
- information about financial aid resources
- assistance with admissions and financial aid applications

The VSAC EOC Program can help you with options that work for you, your family, and your job:

- part-time study, including day, evening, and weekend classes
- online classes
- college credit for prior learning and life experience
- short-term trainings that lead to certificates or credentials

Financial aid is available for eligible adult students:

- state and federal grants for both full-time and part-time study
- advancement grants for short-term education/training or college "tryout" courses to encourage further study
- scholarships
- interest-free (possibly forgivable) loans for short-term training
