Subject: Soliciting Public Comments through November 19, 2021
 on Replacing the Observational Content of the Current
 Post Tropical Cyclone Report (PSH) Text Product with a
 Comma-Separated Values (CSV) File

The National Weather Service (NWS) is soliciting public comments through November 19, 2021 on a proposed new format for providing observational information after a tropical cyclone event. Currently, the Post Tropical Cyclone Report (PSH) text product provides observational information associated with a tropical cyclone event and is issued by each Weather Forecast Office (WFO) that issued land-based tropical cyclone hazards during the event. The NWS is proposing to change the format of the observational information to a comma-separated values (CSV) file to better meet the needs of users who wish to more readily query the data.
