- Subject: WFO Honolulu, HI to Issue Coastal Flood Statements: Effective May 21, 2021

Beginning on or about May 21, 2021, the NWS Weather Forecast Office (WFO) in Honolulu, Hawaii (HFO) will begin issuing Coastal Flood Statements for minor coastal flooding due to extreme high tides. HFO will issue these statements under the existing Coastal Hazard Message (CFW) product, which is also used for High Surf Warning and High Surf Advisory hazards.

HFO has been using Special Weather Statements (SPS) to communicate the flooding hazard from extreme tides. When HFO implements this change, the office will stop using SPS and start using CFW to better indicate the hazard.

There will be no changes to AWIPS identifiers or World Meteorological Organization (WMO) headers. The possible CFW hazards and their associated Valid Time Event Codes (VTEC) are:
