I represent Respondent in the case referenced above. Petitioners filed their petition for a writ of certiorari on April 4, 2022, and this matter was placed on the docket on April 6, 2022. Respondent's response to the petition is due May 6, 2022. Pursuant to Supreme Court Rule 30.4, I write to request a 60-day extension of time to file a response to the petition. Petitioners consent to this 60-day extension.

This extension is needed because of the press of other matters, including a motion for summary judgment due May 5 in *Morton v. Twitter, Inc., et al.*, No. 20-cv-10434 (C.D. Cal.), a reply brief due May 9 in *Green, et al. v. United States Department of Justice, et al.*, No. 21-5195 (D.C. Cir.), an answering brief due May 27 in *Doe, et al. v. Google LLC, et al.*, No. 21-16934 (9th Cir.), and an anticipated June 2, 2022, in-person hearing in *Athos Overseas, Ltd. v. YouTube, Inc., et al.*, No. 21-cv-21698 (S.D. Fla.). I also have a previously scheduled vacation from May 20 to May 25.

For these reasons, I respectfully request a 60-day extension of time, until July 5, 2022, to file a response to the petition.
