The Chairman of the American Samoa Medical Center Board of Directors, Dr. Malouamaua Tuiolosega sent his regards to Governor Lemanu P. S. Mauga in a correspondence dated March 16, 2022. The policies include:

- 1. Re-Classification of LBJ Wages, Compensation, and Pay Structure;
- 2. Recruit native, local, and qualified Doctors, Nurses, and Healthcare Specialists;
- Education, Training, and Certification across the spectrum of the rank and file of LBJ Healthcare providers;
- 4. Integrating Technology in all aspects of LBJ's operations;
- 5. Evaluating the "new" hospital concept and providing a recommendation for consideration.

Governor Lemanu commends the Chairman and the Board of Directors for their efforts to realign their priorities. "We are in a State of Emergency, and the COVID-19 virus is rapidly spreading throughout our communities," stated Governor Lemanu. He continued, "The highest priority has always been the overall wellbeing of the people of American Samoa. Our
