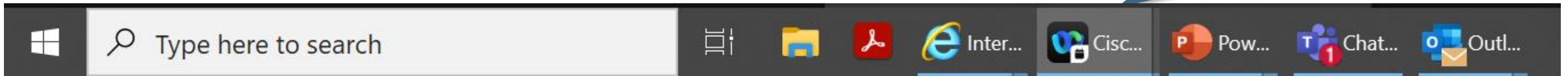


If you chose Option 2: Join from the Webex App

You may be asked to download to the Webex App. (Note: This option may take additional time)

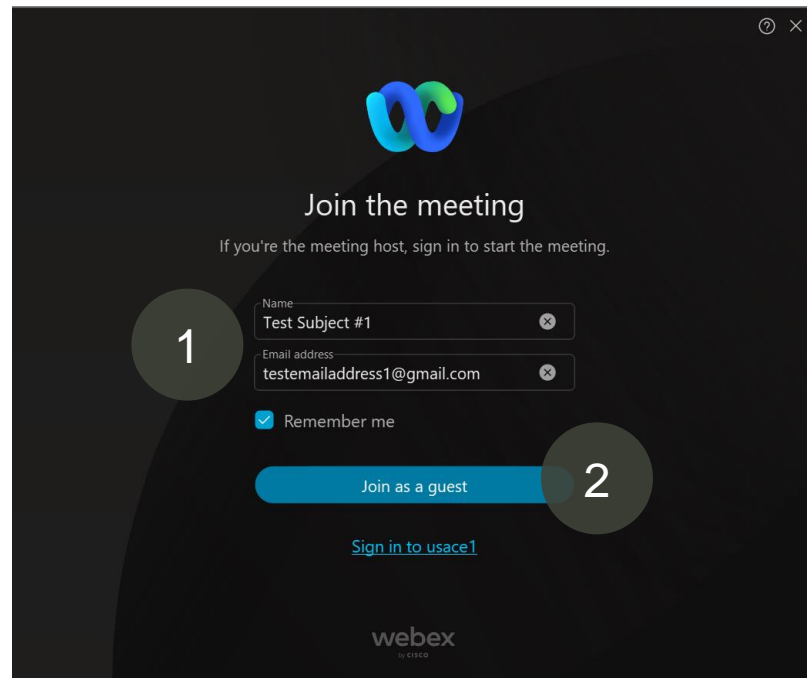
WebEx will open in a separate window, not your browser. WebEx icon is on your taskbar (at the bottom of the screen).

Click the taskbar icon to enter WebEx room.



Then when prompted,

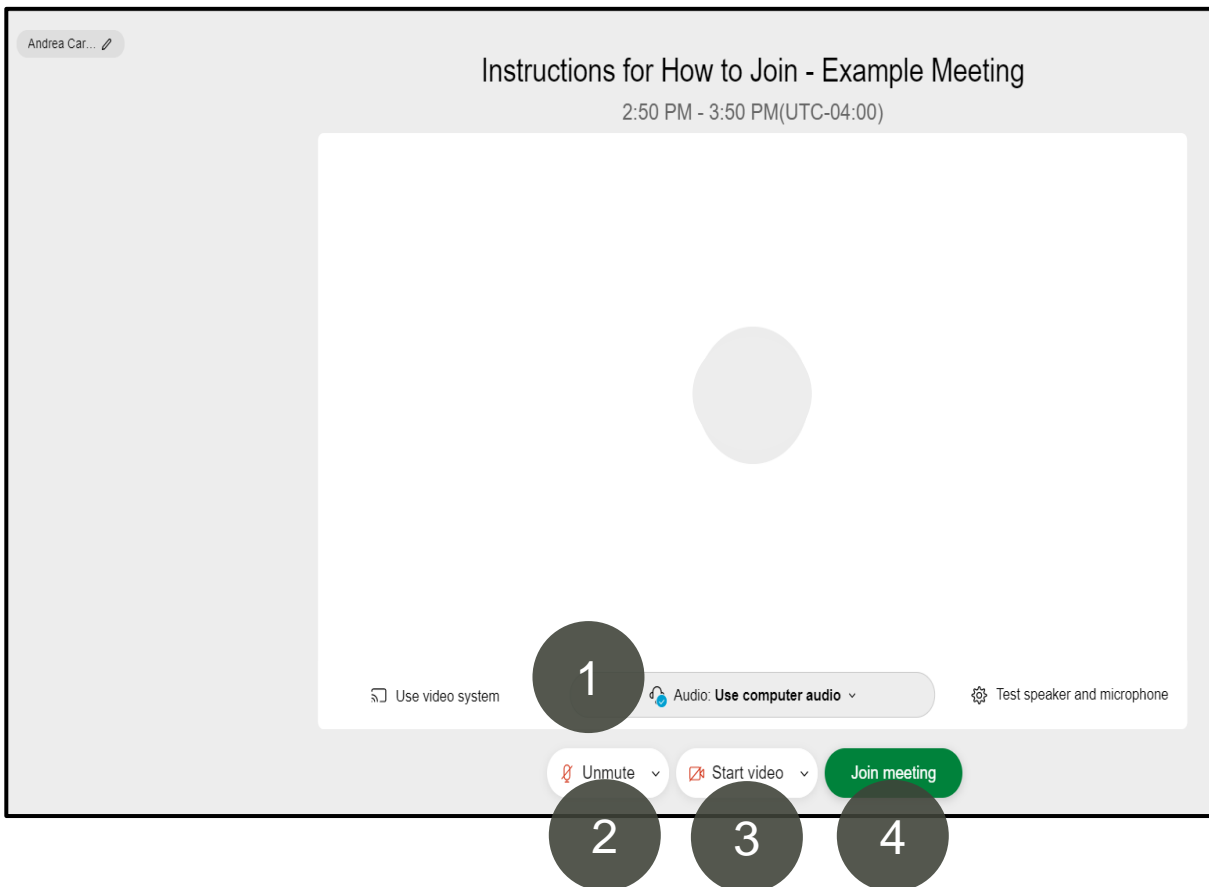
- 1) Enter in your name and email address. If so, please provide your FULL NAME (and AFFILIATION, if applicable)

GETTING STARTED OVERVIEW



1) You will be asked to select your audio option. We recommend ***selecting the 'Call Me' option***. See Slide 5 for instructions on selecting other **audio** options.

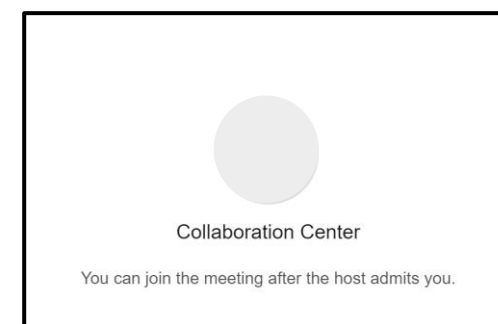
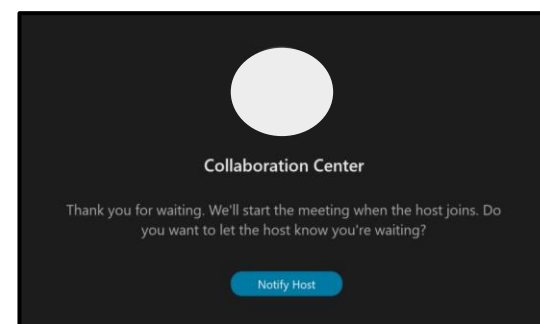
2) You will have the option to unmute/mute your audio. **Click the "Mute" button on the interface.** You will have the option to unmute once you enter the space.

3) You have the option to start your video. For this meeting, we recommend you **do not turn on your video**.

4) Once you've made your selections, you're all set! Hit "Join Meeting" to join the space.

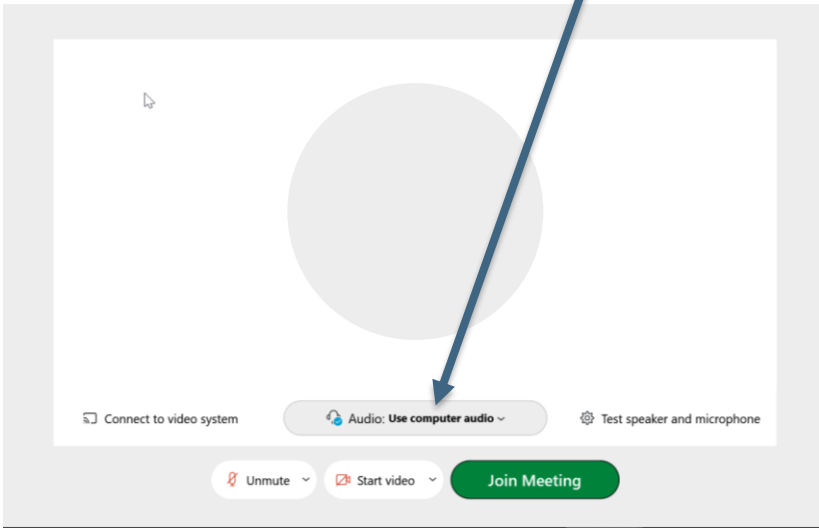
If you chose the 'Call Me' option, once you're admitted – your phone will ring. Follow the instructions given to you by the operator.

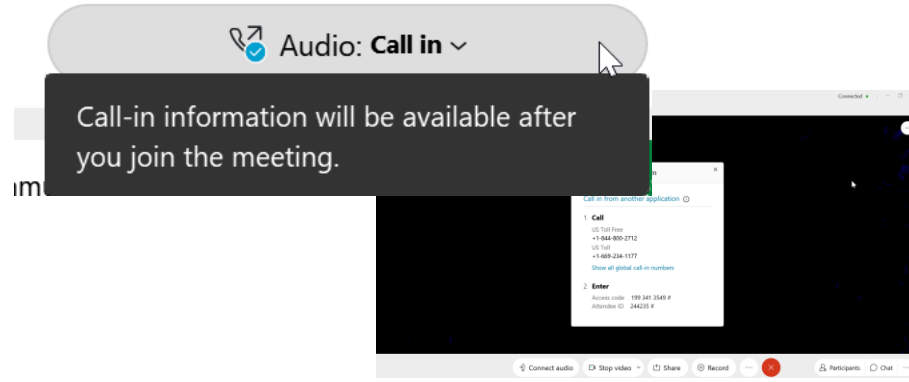
Option A (very highly recommended):

Progress Update

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Pittsburgh District is revising the Mosquito Creek Lake Master Plan (MP). The Master Plan guides the use of government-owned and leased lands around the lake. This will impact future use of natural resources and recreational activities at Mosquito Creek Lake for the next 25 years. This is your opportunity to let the Corps know how you would like the reservoir to be managed in the future.

Update (as of September 8, 2021): This Master Plan update is just getting started. The scoping phase will kick-off on October 14, 2021 and will end on November 13, 2021. Following the scoping phase for the MP, we will work to prepare a draft for an updated MP and create an Environmental Assessment (EA) for the MP. At that time we will release both the draft MP and the EA for public review.

How can you use this page? Explore the website to learn more about the Master Plan update process and proposed content as it's developed. Then, tell us what about Mosquito Creek Lake is most important to you and share what you'd like to do and see changed in the future at the reservoir!
